Title: "Which is Given for You"

Focus: Jesus Gave Himself for You. - Lord's Supper

#### Intro:

- 1. The Focus of the Lord's Supper is Jesus.
- 2. As Jesus walked the earth, He lived as a servant of God, submitting and offering Himself to God. The full display of this is seen in the events of Calvary.
- 3. By participating in the Lord's Supper His disciples are called to remember His offering of His body in punishment and the shedding of His blood in death.

### **Body**:

#### He Sacrificed Himself

- What Jesus endured as not pleasurable.
- Sometimes as a servant of God there will be unpleasant events.
- However, Jesus' motivation was not the pleasure of the event, but the pleasure of His Father.

#### What He Endured He Did Not Do for Himself

- It was for no reason of His own He faced humiliation at the hands of the Romans and His own people.
- He didn't deserve what He endured.
- His was a sacrificial act. In giving Himself to God, He was offering Himself for God's purposes, our redemption.

#### He Gave Himself for You

- He gave Himself for Your sins and mine.
- He gave Himself so you and I could enter into a new agreement with God, a relationship based on relationship and not laws.
- He gave Himself so you and I could have a quality of life that would have been impossible otherwise.

## Are You Willing to Give Yourself to Him?

- The only condition to partaking of the Lord's Supper is the manner in which you come (vv. 27 & 28).
- One who comes not having partaken of the benefit of the new life Jesus offers, comes in the wrong manner.
- It is hard to for a person to commemorate what he or she has not experienced.
- It is hard for a person who has given his or her life to Jesus, but is living a rebellious existence outside of His rule and reign to commemorate the sacrificial servant life of Jesus either.
- So, are you living your life on earth as a servant of God, fully offering yourself to Him?
